ANNUAL REVIEW 2014 MAJOR EVENTS FROM A BUSY YEAR

FIRST TRANSFER OF DONATIONS

January: Through the generous support of its donors, Tumaini Fund Canada was able to send its first transfer of \$12,000 to Kagera. The funds were designated for child sponsorship, secondary school fees, goats, bicycles, solar lamps and a new Tumaini house.

THE GIFT OF A 40' CONTAINER

June: This generous gift of the container and shipping costs to Kagera, Tanzania was made by ICROSS Canada through Billy Willbond and filled by Compassionate Resource Warehouse through Dell Marie Wergeland and her team of hardworking volunteers who packed every cubic inch with school supplies, tools, hospital equipment, sewing machines, medical supplies, wheel chairs, clothing and IZZY dolls for the children. The container sailed from Vancouver on June 17th.

TUMAINI CRAFTERS and FRIENDS

Every third Wednesday in each month, Crafters meet at St. Mary's church hall in Nanoose Bay. Toting sewing machines, scissors, crochet hooks and knitting needles, they work against the lovely background music provided by Graham Gates. Beautiful cotton dresses, shirts and pants are sewn, sweaters knitted and blankets crocheted to be shipped to Kagera for Tumaini orphans.

We were so pleased to announce that thanks to the leadership and efforts of Grace Tanaka, Tumaini Fund Canada has now expanded to Vancouver under the sponsorship of Holy Trinity Church. This new group of volunteers has been knitting sweaters, blankets and toques and plans to add sewing dresses too.

SECOND TRANSFER OF FUNDS

July: Thanks to the hard work of volunteers and generosity of many donors, a second transfer of \$15,500 was made to Kagera. Donations were designated to be spent according to the wishes of the donors, for child sponsorship, goats and shelters, child registration, solar lamps and a new house. Undesignated general donations were assigned to Secondary School fees at the request of Dr. Wilson. The annual cost of \$100 for each student is a huge undertaking to fund each year.

CHILD SPONSORSHIPS

This very personal commitment has been made by a growing number of people, who have undertaken the permanent sponsorship of a child or family of Tumaini orphans. At a cost of \$100 per year per child (or \$8 monthly), the personal sponsorships are so welcome to help support the thousands of orphans under Tumaini care.

CONTAINER ARRIVAL IN TANZANIA

<u>September</u>: After many anxious months of prayer, as this huge container with its precious cargo sailed across the seas with the final phase of the journey past Somali pirates, we all sighed with relief when it safely arrived in Dar es Salaam on September 8th.

Little did we know it would take a further stressful 5 weeks of worry and prayers before Tanzanian customs officials would release the container to continue its journey to Kagera.

OVERLAND TRANSPORT

<u>October</u>: Finally securely loaded on a truck, the container began the arduous journey over difficult terrain.

A few days later came the first problem as the truck suffered a mechanical breakdown and the container was transferred to another truck.

The further problem arose just a few kilometers from its destination in Muleba, when a wheel became deeply mired in the sandy road. The local Tumaini team awaiting the container decided to unload the container at the point of breakdown.

Thankfully the rains held off as the container contents were all transferred to the safety of the vocational school.



Eventually all items will be unpacked, sorted and distributed, with further updates to follow.

CONTAINER TO FINAL BASE

<u>December</u>: After waiting for a suitable crane to handle this large 40'container, it was finally unloaded from the truck and placed on a permanent base near the Muleba office.





The container will provide invaluable storage for Tumaini for many future needs.
