Dresses from Canada & Guernsey via Dr. Susan Wilson to Kagera : February 2015

Distributed to 2 very needy young girls living as slaves

In February 2015, on her annual visit to Kagera, Susan visited a community in the Diocese of Lweru, on the banks of Lake Victoria.

She learned the very sad story of one destitute family.

The grandfather had sold his property before he died and left his son (a widower whose wife had died from AIDS) and two granddaughters without anything.

They were taken in by the village head man, and given a corner in the house to sleep at night. During the day, all three were virtual slaves of this family, forced to work all day in exchange for a roof over their heads and enough food to survive.

The father's face reflects his sadness and despair for the future for his two daughters and himself, but he has managed to come to church.

There Susan meets the family and has beautiful dresses to give them and the happy smile on the father's face is wonderful. Tumaini help has arrived!

Tumaini's plans for the family are to purchase a plot of land for the father, and have a Tumaini house built for them.

The girls are now registered with Tumaini and have received clothing, school uniforms, books and pencils and are attending the local school. In Susan's own words..... " ***Jesus is still doing miracles***".
